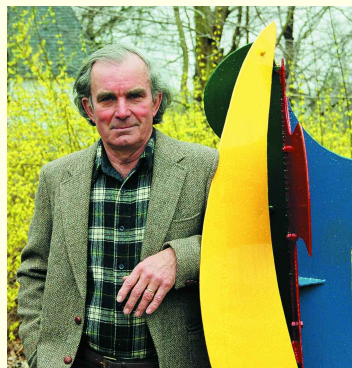
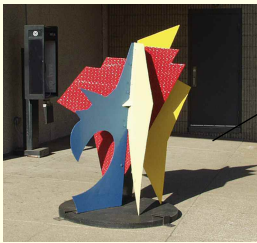
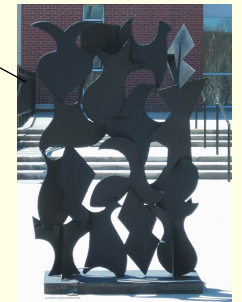
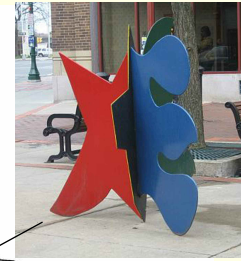


Sculpture in Syracuse

Twelve large sculptures by the artist David Hayes are in downtown Syracuse for one year. The City of Syracuse, the Cultural Resources Council, the Syracuse Downtown Committee, the Everson Museum and the 40 Below Public Arts Task Force collaborated with the artist to mount this outdoor exhibition on downtown streets and parks, coupled with four additional large sculptures on the grounds of the Everson Museum. David Hayes was born in Hartford, Connecticut and received an A.B. degree from the University of Notre Dame in 1953 and a M.F.A. degree from Indiana University in 1955 where he studied with David Smith. He has received a post-doctoral Fulbright award and a Guggenheim Fellowship. He is a recipient of the Logan Prize for Sculpture and an award from the National Institute of Arts and Letters. He has had over 300 exhibitions and is included in over 100 institutional collections including that of the Museum of Modern Art and the Guggenheim Museum in New York. He resides in Coventry, Connecticut.
